

This easy design incorporates the use of Icy Mylar flakes and a custom glitter mix.



Begin by removing the shine from the natural nail with a medium grit file or arbor band.



Remove the oils and dust from the natural nails with Swipe, and apply two coats of Protein Bond.



Apply the Artistic Nail Forms to each finger.



If there is any separation between the flakes and the acrylic , add some wet Speed Clear to fill in the space.



Use a small wet pearl of custom glitter mix (Ozone, Rock Star, Diamond Dust, Punk Rock, Sky Blue) and apply it to the center of the natural free edge.



Lighty spread it across the natural free edge while fading it into the Mylar flakes.



With the glitter residue on the tip of the brush, tap the tip on the nail plate to make it look like it is fading into the natural nail.



If there is any separation between the flakes and the acrylic, add some wet Speed Clear to fill in the space.



Use a small wet pearl of custom glitter mix (Ozone, Rock Star, Diamond Dust, Punk Rock, Sky Blue) and apply it to the center of the natural free edge.



Lighty spread it across the natural free edge while fading it into the Mylar flakes.



With the glitter residue on the tip of the brush, tap the tip on the nail plate to make it look like it is fading into the natural nail.



Make sure the glitter is lightly faded into the natural nail.



Starting from the cuticle area, apply Speed Clear flush to the natural nail.



Work the Speed Clear through the body of the enhancement.



If necessary, apply an additional pearl of Speed Clear to cover the free edge.



Allow the product to set.



It is your option to use the Magic Wand to pinch the body into a narrower shape.



Place the proper size C Curve stick under the free edge and hold it into shape.



Begin by filing the structure into the perfect shape using the I Formation road map.



File the side walls straight.



Buff the surface with a sponge buffer to remove any imperfections.



Add Finish Gel to the surface and cure for 2 minutes.
